 - o One reference letters from your community, school or 4-H
- Use scholarship towards full-time, post-secondary education financing for study in agriculture, equipment technician, engineering or business within Canada.
- Winners must use the funds within one year of receipt of the award for attendance at a Canadian postsecondary institution. Funding may be used for tuition, books and/or lodging.
- Recipients must provide proof of full-time enrollment in a Canadian post-secondary institution and receipts totaling at least \$2000 to claim their award.
- Applicants must grant permission to John Deere Canada ULC and the Canadian 4-H Council to use their name and/or photograph, province of residence and area of study in a media release to promote John Deere Canada ULC 4-H Scholarships.

Selection Criteria:

Applicants will be awarded a \$2000 scholarship according to residence within the area specified by
the sponsoring dealership and based on a combination of numerical grade point average for their
most recent school year, for their community involvement, experience and essay. The participating
John Deere dealership may specify additional criteria – please contact your local John Deere dealer
to see if they are participating.

Applications must be received no later than 11:59pm on May 31, 2013. Please e-mail, mail or fax your school transcript, essay and reference letter to Canadian 4-H Council, Attn: Sue Wood. It is the sole responsibility of the applicant to confirm receipt with the Canadian 4-H Council.
