

# Additional Heifer Show Information

- Cattle will be housed at the Stark County Fairgrounds – 305 Wertz Ave NE – Canton, Ohio 44708.
- Shavings, hay & beet pulp will be provided.
- For health requirements please contact the Ohio Department of Agriculture at 614-728-6220 or online at [www.agri.ohio.gov](http://www.agri.ohio.gov).
- A night crew will be provided each night along with a day crew on Thursday so that junior members can participate in the convention activities.
- Junior Convention Early Registration is \$125 which includes all activities from the afternoon of Wednesday, July 5 through the morning of Saturday, July 8.
- PBS Animal Health will have show supplies available for sale at the fairgrounds.
- Sign up for Showmanship classes will be available after arrival at the fairgrounds.

## National Junior Show Rules

### Eligibility

1. Junior must be 9 - 21 years of age by January 1 of the current year.
2. Identified females: RF (Recorded Female), ID or IDR (Identified Females) animals are not eligible to be shown.
3. a. In all classes, the recorded ownership must show in the sole ownership of the exhibitor or partnership comprised of only BSA Junior Members. (Adult-Junior and family farm partnerships are not acceptable.) All transfers and recorded ownership must be dated by August 1st of the current year for all classes.(All transfers and ownership must be recorded by July 6, 2017 to show at the heifer show.) If joint ownership, one of the owners must be declared the exhibitor during check-in. Awards will be presented as one unit, to all owners equally. Effective January 1, 2016.  
b. Animals that are leased through the National Brown Swiss Association Lease Program (recorded by June 1st of current year) are also eligible to be shown as juniors. The leased animal's recorded owner will receive open show awards.
4. Junior must be a National Junior Member. Junior membership is free.

### Procedures To Be Completed Before the Show

1. A representative of the national association will check the registration papers for junior-exhibited animals the day before the show. This is in addition to the "check-in" done by Show Management the day prior.
2. Each junior will receive a shirt to wear when showing in the Junior Show.

### Showing

1. In junior shows, the junior member who owns the animal is to show her. If the owner cannot attend the show, another National Brown Swiss Association junior member may show the animal. Also, in a class where a junior member owns more than one animal; another National Brown Swiss Association junior member may show the second animal

\*Alternate Leadsperson form needs to be complete and submitted to the show committee by Thursday July 6 at 4:00 PM

2. If for some reason the junior is having trouble showing the animal, another junior may assist but the junior owner must continue to accompany the animal.
3. Exhibitors are required to wear white pants. Show shirts will be provided along with an official entry number, which also must be worn.
